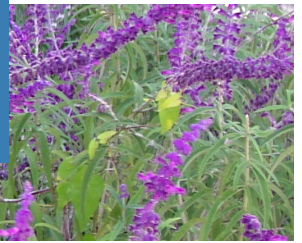


# Biology 123: Biology for Health-Related Sciences/ Non-Majors

**Course Description:** This course is an overview of biological principles important for the health sciences majors and non-major in today's world. Principles of biochemistry, cell biology, genetics, and organismic biology are addressed. *Credit is not applicable toward a biology major or minor.*

**Textbook:** *Inquiry into Life*, Sylvia S. Mader & Michael Windelspecht, 2014. 14th edition, McGraw Hill. Access to the "connect" website for the textbook is required for the course. It can be purchased on its own (including access to the electronic book) or as included with the new textbook. It does not come included with the used book. If you buy online access on its own (either from the bookstore or the connect website) you can buy a loose-leaf copy of the textbook from the connect website for \$10.

You are responsible for all such communication on the learn course page, so please check regularly.

## **Student Learning Objectives:**

- 1.) Students will display an understanding of the logic of scientific research.
  - 2.) Students will show comprehension of the chemistry of life including: atomic structure and bonding, movement of molecules, important biological molecules, and metabolic pathways and reactions.
  - 3.) Students will exhibit familiarity with the structure, function and replication of cells and DNA.
  - 4.) Students will demonstrate knowledge of basic concepts and mechanisms of human genetics and inheritance.
  - 5.) Students will understand basic concepts of human physiology including tissue, organ and organ system structure and functions.
- The goal of this class is to help you become literate in these scientific concepts and be able to apply them in your life as you move forward.

**Attendance:** Attendance is Required for all classes. Students are responsible for getting information presented in any class missed. Students may be dropped from the class after 4 absences. Attendance will be taken via a daily sign-in sheet. Excessive tardiness (greater than 10 minutes) will be counted as an absence. Quizzes and Exams will begin promptly at the beginning of the period. **Arriving late for a quiz or exam could result in a score of zero.**

**Learning Center:** The learning center has 4 tutors ready to help Biology 123 students. Call the learning center at 925-8907 for available hours. **Learning Objectives:** For each chapter/ topic covered, you will be provided with a list of learning objectives. This list will include the relevant vocabulary terms and concepts that will be covered in that chapter and that you will be responsible for on quizzes and exams.

**Learn Smart Activities:** Through the course connect webpage (go to this address to register: (<https://connect.mheducation.com/class/b-flicker--spring-2016-tr-130-245>) ) you will be responsible to complete activities for each chapter by the due date. These are designed to help you target your studying to areas where you are in need of work so that you can be more effective and efficient in your studying. These activities will be a part of your grade and are required for you to pass the course.

**Exams:** 4 exams will be given. The first 3 will be worth 100 points each. The final exam will be cumulative, comprised of new material covered since the third midterm as well as all previous material. The final exam will be worth 150 points.

**Quizzes:** 8 online quizzes will be given throughout the semester. (~1 per week) These will be worth 5 points each. These will be used as practice for the in-class quizzes and exams. If you are struggling on these quizzes you will likely struggle on the in-class quizzes & exams. If you need help please see me or check out the learning center. Studying for the sciences often requires different study methods from those used in other courses. I am here to help you succeed in this course in any way I can.

4 in-class quizzes will also be given throughout the semester. These will be used to help judge your preparedness for the exams. They will cover the same topics as the exams, in less detail. The combination of the 2 quiz types should prepare you for the material present on the exams.

**Study Aids:** Studying the sciences is, in some ways, similar to learning a foreign language. There are a lot of vocabulary terms that are critical to learn in order to understand the concepts of the course. To aid in that I highly recommend making flash cards of the relevant vocabulary terms given out by the instructor.

A course web page of these critical vocabulary terms has been set up on the studyblue ([studyblue.com](http://studyblue.com)) server for use on computers and smartphones.
