There are some changes we would like to vote on at the March 28 meeting. Dani Martinez, Handbook Committee chair, sent out an email before Spring Break explaining the different options. These changes are because of comments on the paper ballots at the end of last semester or because of things that have come up that require clarification. Recently an email went out to the ALLFAC-L listserv about mediation training for faculty. Please, if you are interested, sign up for this training. It would be nice to have a good pool of people to choose from to serve on our Conflict Resolution Committee, especially since one of the proposed changes in the Handbook is for all members of this committee to have the mediation training. The FAC account can probably reimburse you for your travel and parking to attend. The training days all Friday, Sept. 7; Saturday, Sept. 8; Friday, Sept. 21, and Saturday, Sept. 22; each day from 8:30 to 4:30. Also, an email went out recently about the next conference of the UNM Mentoring Institute. I'm not familiar with the buzz words in this discipline so I'm not sure the significance of the focus of the upcoming conference on "developmental relationships," but I do feel it might be worth some of us attending as we can. The early-bird registration deadline is June 15, 2012 so there may not be Faculty Professional Development funds available (the next batch won't be available until this coming fall) but maybe we can talk to Dean Sax or Dr. Letteney about some matching funds for the Faculty Assembly to send at least one person to this conference.

We're over the hump of the semester and slipping down the back side toward finals week. Hope you manage to cover all your learning objectives and I'll see you at the meeting Wednesday, March 28 from 1:30 to 3:00 in LRC101C. —

Message from Dr. Letteney

To My Colleagues:

I was on annual leave last week and so am sending you a brief report for your March Faculty Assembly Meeting. Governor Martinez signed both the budget bill and the GO Bond bill this month. We are very pleased that UNM-Valencia Campus will be included in the General Obligation Bond for HVAC improvements and more parking. The election for that bond issue which also includes some funding for our library will be this November. I will be in Washington, DC at the HACU Legislative Conference this week to get updates on legislation from HACU and meet with staff from our Congressional Delegations. I will be discussing the importance of both Pell Grants and HSI Grants for our students.

I hope you all had a relaxing Spring Break. I will see you this week.

Dean of Instruction Update

The Summer 2012 and Fall 2012 schedules are in completed form and will be sent to the publisher today (March 28). However, there may still be some adjustments, mostly deletions, since we continue to be over budget in terms of summer salary budget and fall adjunct salary budget. Given the number of new fulltime faculty members we have added, our adjunct pay expenditures should be going down somewhat. I will be in contact with scheduling chairs and directors in the next few days and weeks to see where we might be able to cancel a few more sections.

Discussions have ensued in both Chairs Council and in Instructional Council concerning a faculty mentoring program for new faculty to begin in Fall, 2012. At present, we are developing the idea of individual 1-on-1 mentoring (senior faculty to junior faculty) arrangements which seem more feasible on a campus where, given everyone's heavy teaching load, it remains very difficult to designate a time (lunch? late afternoon? early morning?) when a critical mass of faculty members are both available and on-campus.

The Strategic Planning Committee is moving toward the conclusion of its revisions to the past (2009-2012) Strategic Plan. We expect to hold what I'm sure we all hope is our final meeting on April 3 (!), and there will be a Town Hall meeting midday on Wednesday, April 18, for community input and feedback. Thanks to everyone who has contributed to this important and worthwhile endeavor.

The third of four spring term Centennial events, produced by Academic Affairs was held on Thursday, March 22. Kudos to Dawn-Marie Lopez and her THEA 130 students who performed an adaptation of The Great Theatre of the World, an *auto sacramentales* from medieval Spain, recast during the time of New Mexico's 1912 statehood. The next and last Centennial event of the term will occur on the evening of Wednesday, April 4, when Patricia Gillikin hosts three extraordinary New Mexico poets: Hakim Bellamy, Damien Flores, and Olivia Gatwood, in the Student Community Center. Please encourage your students and other members of the **UNM-Valencia** community to attend what will likely be a memorable event!







Celebrate New Mexico: Exhibition of Artist Interpretations of *So Far From God* by Ana Castillo

Mathematics Department News

Our algebra course redesign project continues to grow and change. Most students have responded very favorably to the computer-based classes. We are now using the iLearn program for students who are continuing in that program from Math 100 but have added a MyMathLab-based program for students who wish to use that instead. Next semester all sections of Math 118 and Math 119 will be computer-based courses. All sections of Math 120 will be lecture. The STEM team is working on multidisciplinary projects that will help students see the relevance of mathematics and the value of learning mathematics. These projects will be incorporated into all sections of Math 118/119/120 and Math 121 in the fall. A committee is also working on revising Math 193. Changes in this course will occur in the fall. I would like to thank the faculty who participated in these projects.

Most members of the math faculty have been busy with professional development activities this past semester. Several faculty members attended OSET trainings on various topics including critical thinking, active learning, and technology. Most of the mathematics faculty also attended the NMHEAR conference last month and many plan to attend the New Mexico Mathematical Association of Two-Year Colleges Conference in May. We are fortunate to have so many dedicated mathematics faculty members who are focused on improving student learning.


All students accepted in our program must pass, with a C or better, the TRiO First Year Experience course. The course is designed to help students gain a fundamental understanding of how attitude, self-management, study, life and workplace skills are the cornerstones to achieving educational and career goals.

We started our FYE course in summer 2007. From then through fall 2011 **72.1% of TRiO/SSS FYE students are still attending, transferred, graduated or graduated and transferred.**

On March 6, Univision (KLUZ TV) broadcasted their visit to our family literacy program at El Cerro Mission Community Center. They interviewed students, an instructor and the child development specialist. This program is very beneficial to those who need to improve their English language skills or prepare for the GED in Spanish but do not have childcare. The child development specialist, provided by the Valencia County Literacy Council, teaches the child (birth to 12)

while the parents participate in classes provided by the Adult Education Center. Then parents spend time with their children and learn about literacy activities they can do with their children. On February 17, Rita Logan and Tina Newby attended the NM Skill Up meeting to learn more about how the TAACCCT grant objectives. Support for Integrated Basic Education and Skills Training has become a top priority in this grant so we have the monetary support we needed to continue what we started in the fall and for the next three years. We look forward to continuing the Personal Care Attendant course as an I-BEST course and adding more to the schedule.

In the meantime, faculty and senior tutors are working on helping students find their career paths and assessing their progress using portfolios. Portfolio assessment adds hours to the work schedule but quality to the process. This will also help student build the skills necessary to be successful in their continuing education.

- 1. Call to order:** Elaine Clark called the meeting to order at 1:35pm.
- 2. Acceptance of agenda:** there was an addition to the agenda. Faculty Development Committee needs to be added. Miriam Gustafson made a motion to approve the agenda as amended with LeAnn Weller as a second.

3. Approval of minutes: Cindy Chavez made a motion to approve the minutes from the November meeting with Julie Dupree as a second; all were in favor.

4. Executive Director's Report:

- Thank you to all who donated or volunteered for this year's Gala. Just over \$10,000 was raised. The endowment is approximately \$820,000. Dr. Letteney would like to see \$1 million. Student body president Victor Escobar spoke at the Gala and did very well.
- The final funding formula proposed by the LFC (Legislative Finance Committee) made sure that 2 year colleges were not disadvantaged. Dr. Letteney would like the Faculty Assembly to thank LFC for their work. The funding formula has not been signed and can still be vetoed by the Governor.
- Money that is "off the top" which is approximately \$100,000.
- GO Bond would give \$1 million to UNMVC for heating, ventilation and cooling upgrades and more parking in the south lot.
- Barbara Lovato added that an additional bond would give UNMVC library \$20,000.
- We are currently working with main campus to lift a 30 credit requirement to receive certificates. UNMVC needs certificates to increase our student completion. However many of our certificates are less than 30 credits.
- The current art exhibit of Elaine Soto was very well done.
- Faculty Assembly are invited to Phi Theta Kappa induction ceremony this Friday, 2/24 at 6:30. There will be a small dinner to accompany the ceremony.
- Scholarships for travelling abroad, our students are eligible so please encourage applications and the deadline is within a few weeks.

5. Dean of Instruction Report:

- Budgeting requests have been reviewed and sent to Andy. It looks like all will be funded.
- NMHEAR conference is 2/23 and 2/24, 18 UNMVC will be attending.
- Summer and fall schedules are currently being worked on and will soon be completed.
- It is a catalog year and work is being done to get that finalized. Work is being done to add the undergraduate degrees of faculty in order to increase attractiveness of UNMVC to students.
- UNMVC has 6 new full-time faculty who has joined this semester. Dr. Sax asked that they be welcomed.
- A search for a Game Design and Simulation Faculty is ongoing.
- New Mexico Centennial events were a success.
- February 10th was the Film Festival, many films were screened, it was very well organized, and was an enjoyable event.
- The Strategic Planning Committee continues to meet. The committee is meeting 2/29 to finalize the plan; however there may be need for a March meeting. A Town Hall meeting has been scheduled for April 18th.
- Dr. Sax ended with allowing any questions.

6. Treasurer's Report

The amount of money in the account for Faculty Assembly is \$154. We have run out of money for snacks so please donate to that fund.

7. Committee Reports:

- Faculty Senate (Melanie Sanchez-Dinwiddie)—there was not much that pertained to UNMVC. A posthumous degree was awarded. Several honorary degrees were voted on. There was some discussion from Tim Ross about the process in the selection of the new UNM President, Robert Frank. Dean Sax added some insight to some of the controversy that arose from the selection of President Frank.
 - i. Dubra Karnes-Padilla has served as the UNMVC representative for 4 years and can no longer serve. Danizete Martinez was voted as the official representative and Melanie Sanchez-Dinwiddie will be the alternate. This new term will start Fall 2012.
- Faculty Development (Tina Newby)—there has been discussion by this committee to create a Faculty Mentoring Program and to work with Najib to increase participation of faculty in using technology. Tina would like input from Faculty Assembly. Khaled offered some suggestions on training for completing FE/DI evaluations and help with the tenure process. John Anderson would like in the mentoring program an emphasis on the importance of committee involvement.
- Curriculum Committee (Alexa Wheeler)—program reviews will be coming up starting at the end of the spring semester and continuing into the fall semester. Information has been added to the <http://www.unm.edu/~vccurric/>. Alexa reviewed the website to familiarize faculty with the upcoming program review process.
- Core Course Assessment (Claudia Barreto)—these are the reports that must be completed in the Spring semester for all core courses. Claudia will be sending an email on VFAC that will contain the form for Core Course Assessments and will also have the list of which courses need reports. Claudia handed to the attending faculty a list of the core courses. Committee members will be available to complete the reports for a variety of time slots later in the semester.
- Faculty Handbook (Dani Martinez)—thank you to all who voted in December on the handbook changes. Everything that was up for vote passed. There will be another vote at the March meeting for more changes that are being reviewed. Dani will be sending out via VFAC the information on the changes that are being proposed.

8. President's Report:

- April 18th is the Strategic Plan Town Hall meeting. This is in conflict with the Faculty Assembly meeting, therefore the Faculty Assembly meeting will be on April 25th.
- Main campus establishes their committees in the spring. If any UNMVC faculty is considering being involved with those now is the time to sign up.

9. Announcements

- Cindy Chavez had a question from Toni Black about who is allowed to be on VFAC. Toni is receiving some requests that she is not sure is appropriate. This topic was discussed previously in Faculty Assembly and Elaine made the remark that we could refer to previous meeting minutes for the decision of who could be on VFAC. Dean

Sax emphasized that VFAC needs to maintain high integrity so that VFAC retains its importance. The discussion ended with the statement that staff should not have access to VFAC.

10. Adjourn: Claudia Barreto made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 2:42pm with a second from Cindy Chavez; all were in favor.
