COURSE DESCRIPTION:	Research Topics is an independent study course that is designed to

	basic research. You and your research advisor will decide on a small
	project that can be completed within 22 hours of laboratory work
	during a single semester. Research will be conducted with the
	guidance and assistance of the student's STEM research advisor and
	the STEM research coordinator.
COURSE OBJECTIVES:	To develop an increased familiarity with laboratory work.

COURSE	Attendance- You are expected to arrive for class promptly. Absence or

	lab notebook will contain a time and effort log and will be kept
	according to good laboratory practices.
	Other- You will be required to periodically meet with your research
	coordinator to determine if you are working a sufficient number of
	hours and whether your lab notebook is acceptable. No "guests" will
	be allowed unless they are explicitly invited to attend the class by the
	instructor.
GRADING:	Research Topics is a one credit hour, credit/no credit course. Credit
	will be given if you successfully complete at least 18 hours of research.
	You can be dropped from Research Topics:
	If you accumulate more than two unexcused absences.
	If your lab notebook is deemed unacceptable by the research
	coordinator at any time during the course.
