1. COURSE OBJECTIVES, DESCRIPTION, AND MATERIALS

1.1 Objectives:

Spanish 1110-501 has been designed to introduce you to the Spanish language and the diverse facets of Hispanic Culture. They also aim to develop basic language skills for both oral (speaking and listening) and written (reading and writing) communication. In this course, the students will develop his\her ability of communicate in Spanish in everyday situation. Throughout the course, the student will:

- Engage in conversations and written communications to describe daily activities, obtain information (name, age....), talk about school life, family, pastimes, vacations plans, express feelings and emotions, and seasons and the weather.
- Develop skills for understanding written and spoken language on the following topics: academic life, family, free time and vacation, social life, customs and traditions.
- Demonstrate an understanding of the cultures in the Americas and Spain.
- Connect with other disciplines and acquire information through Spanish.

1.2 Description:

This class emphasize in learning of Spanish for real world purposes in a contextualized way. The student will participate in individual and pair group

activities that will give him/her the opportunity to practice Spanish in a relaxed environment. Grammar is necessary to learn structures and for communication; however, vocabulary, discourse strategies and familiarity with the cultural norms are equally important and will also remain a focus of this course.

The course requires regular classroom participation and approximately two hours of outside preparation (Listening, writing, reading, and grammar study) for every hour of class. Homework is absolutely important on this learning process. Assignments are offered on every class basis.

The students will have 5 assessments test (one per every chapter) in total and a final exam.

2. GENERAL COURSE POLICIES

- b) Final exam (10%) The Final exam is cumulative from all chapters covered and will consist in the following sections: Listening Comprehension, vocabulary, grammar structure, reading and an oral part examination.
