Prerequisite: Grade of C (not C-) or better in Math 123 and Math 150

Grades: Your grade will be based on your performance on the following assignments and exams.

To receive a passing grade for this course you must have at least 70% overall.

Homework: 100 points based on completion. **Quizzes:** 12 quizzes; lowest 2 dropped for a total of 100 points. **2 in-class tests:** 100 points each. **Final Exam:** 150 percentage points. **This is a total of 550 points. The final grade will be your total divide by 6. To calculator your grade "so far" add the total points received so far and divide by the total points possible so far.**

Grading: To get full credit on graded work students must address all mathematical components presented by the problem, showing all steps and calculations. The use of proper notation, well-structured procedures, and legibility will be taken into account when assigning points.

Calculator policy: Calculators are NOT ALLOWED on any tests or quizzes, including the Final Exam. A calculator may be necessary on the homework.

Notes of any kind, 3x5 cards, books, cell phones, computers, headphones etc. are NOT ALLOWED on any quizzes or tests, including the Final Exam.

Homework: a) Your homework is your most important effort in this class; homework is how you actually learn the material that will be on the quizzes and exams. Expect to do 2-3 hours of homework for every hour of class meeting time (on average 10-15 hours per week). Keep all of your homework together in a folder so that if you are having trouble in the course, you can bring it with you when you go to see your instructor or get tutoring. b) Most homework is done with pen and paper and will only be graded for completion.

Attendance: Attendance is mandatory. If a student has three or more unexcused absences he/she may be dropped from the course. Tardiness or early departure may be regarded as absence. Please note that it is the student's responsibility to drop the course if he/she stops attending. A failing grade may be assigned if a student stops attending and does not drop.

Missed Exams: If you miss an exam, contact your instructor immediately. Make-up tests will only be given in appropriate circumstances and if you miss an exam and do not contact your instructor immediately, you will be dropped from the course.
