	Write down your <u>UNM ID Number (sometimes referred to as Banner ID)</u> , which is a 9-digit number included on your acceptance letter, in the space below. You will need your UNM ID Number when contacting any campus office such as Admissions, Financial Aid, or Advising. UNM ID Number					
	Submit your official high school or high school equivalent transcript, along with all official college transcripts to <u>unmvaregistrar@unm.edu</u> or have them mailed to the UNM-Valencia Registrar's Office at 280 La Entrada Rd, Los Lunas, NM 87031.					
	Set up your Net ID (your UNM username) to access UNM's systems including LoboWeb, LoboAchieve, LoboMail, and Blackboard Learn. If you are not sure what a Net ID is or how to set one up, click here for more information. Net ID Password					
	Your UNM NetID and password allow you to access your LoboMail email account. Federal law requires that you have a university email account where UNM can contact you securely. Please check this email account frequently.					
	Register for New Student Orientation.					
	If you do not have recent ACT or SAT scores available, use <u>LoboMail</u> (your UNM email account) to schedule a testing appointment with our test administrator, Joshua Owen at <u>iowen2@unm.edu</u> . Be sure to include your first & last name, date of birth, and your 9-digit UNM ID number in the email. You can prepare for the English and/or Math placement test(s) by utilizing an online resource <u>here</u> . You can also contact your Academic Advisor if you are interested in more comprehensive placement test preparation program.					
	Utilize <u>LoboAchieve</u> to make an appointment with your Academic Advisor at least 2 weeks before registration to plan out and sign up for your courses. Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

FAFSA is an application for Federal Student Aid that the federal government uses to determine *projected* eligibility for federal grants, loans, work-study, and scholarships. UNM-Valencia may use information providedon the FAFSA to determine eligibility for state grants and scholarships. This application opens every October 1st. You will need to fill it out once a year to be eligible for financial aid.

For assistance with completing the FAFSA you can book an appointment with Financial Aid or call 505-925-8590.

If you are not a U.S. citizen, please contact the Financial Aid Office regarding your funding options. Si no tiene ciudadania de los Estados Unidos, por favor contacte la oficina de ayuda financiera con respecto a sus opciones.

Before starting your FAFSA you will need to create your Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID). If you are considered a <u>dependent student (see page 3 for more information)</u>, one of your parents must also create an FSA ID. This ID will be used every October 1st, so be sure to keep the username and password somewhere safe. <u>Click here</u> to create your own FSA ID and password.

What is the FSA ID?

• The FSA ID gives you and your parent(s) access to FSA online systems (FAFSA). Student and parent must have their own individual FSA ID to sign the application. **DO NOT** use the same email for both student and parent.

NOTE: Please carefully read instructions and use the "see text" option to ensure that you are entering accurate data. You will be required to verify your email address. Do not close the browser until you enter the verification code and get a confirmation that your FSA ID is successfully created.
