- ☐ Utilize **LoboAchieve** to make an appointment with your **Academic Advisor** at least 2 weeks before registration to **plan out and sign up for your courses**. Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

fafsa.gov

FAFSA is an application for Federal Student Aid that the federal government uses to determine *projected* eligibility for federal grants, loans, work-study, and scholarships. UNM-Valencia may use information provided on the FAFSA to determine eligibility for state grants and scholarships. This application opens every October 1st. You will need to fill it out once a year to be eligible for financial aid.

Before starting your FAFSA you will need to create your Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID). If you are considered a **dependent student (see page 3 for more information)**, one of your parents must also create an FSA ID. This ID will be used every October 1st, so be sure to keep the username and password somewhere safe. [Click here](#) to create your own FSA ID and password.

What is the FSA ID?

- The FSA ID gives you and your parent(s) access to FSA online systems (FAFSA). Student and parent must have their own individual FSA ID to sign the application. **DO NOT use the same email for both student and parent.**

NOTE: Please carefully read instructions and use the "see text" option to ensure that you are entering accurate data. You will be required to verify your email address. Do not close the browser until you enter the verification code and get a confirmation that your FSA ID is successfully created.

You may be selected for verification and required to provide the institution documentation to verify information reported on the FAFSA.

Most requirements can be completed or submitted online.

Financial Aid - Student Dependency Status

The federal student aid programs are based on the concept that it is primarily the student/parent(s) responsibility to pay for your education.

If you can check **one or more** of the following, you may be an independent student:

- ☐ 24 years or older
- ☐ Married
- ☐ Have legal dependents other than a spouse
- ☐ Graduate or professional student
- ☐ Veteran
- ☐ Member of the armed forces
- ☐ Orphan
- ☐ Ward of the court
- ☐ Emancipated minor
- ☐ Someone who is homeless or at risk of becoming homeless



If you **CANNOT** check any items, you are considered a **dependent student**.

Your parent(s) will also be required to provide the following information on your FAFSA:

- Date(s) of birth
- Social Security number(s)
- Marital Status and date
- Assets
- Taxed and untaxed income
- Businesses
- Investments

If you checked orphan, ward of court, emancipated minor or someone who is homeless or at risk of becoming homeless please contact the Financial Aid office for additional assistance with completing your financial aid file.

Remember, if you receive Financial Aid, you are required to maintain **Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)** in order to continue to be eligible for aid in future semesters. Your progress is calculated each semester based on the criteria below. For questions about SAP, contact the Financial Aid Office at **505-925-8590**.

Completion Rate

- Complete 67% of total credits attempted.
- Non-passing or incomplete grades and withdrawals affect your rate

Grade Point Average

- Earn a minimum 1.7 GPA for 1-30 credit hrs
- Earn a minimum 2.0 for 30+ credit hrs

Maximum Time Frame

- Be registered in a degree seeking program and be progressing
- Complete the degree within 150% of credits required for that degree
