Course Description

The following courses, ARTH 101, ARTH 201, ARTH 202, are strongly recommended to all students in the study of art history and related studio areas.

History of Art I is a web enhanced course chronologically covering Prehistoric, Near Eastern, Egyptian, Greek, Roman, Early Christian, Byzantine, Romanesque, Gothic and Early Renaissance Art.

Student Learning Objectives

Through readings, slide lectures and interactive assessments the student will be able to:

- understand and use the vocabulary of art
- identify purposes of art and the roles of the artist
- distinguish the elements & principles of design in different styles and explain how they are being used in a given work of art
- recognize some of the materials and processes involved in the production of a work of art
- discuss art in a historical and cultural context

Student Responsibilities

Students are required to attend every class on time, participate in discussions, clicker quizzes and maintain a safe respectable, positive class environment.
