Why do we need more Accessibility?

Providing **ACCESSIBILITY** benefits to ALL learners, addressing diversity and learning differences, and generally supporting learning for all students. Oh yes, and there is this little thing called the LAW.

April 24, 2024 - the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) published a final rule updating Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). This rule mandates that public colleges and universities ensure their digital content—including websites, learning management systems (LMS), and mobile applications—is accessible to individuals with disabilities. ADA

Key Highlights of the New Rule

- Compliance Deadline: Public higher education institutions must comply by April 24,
 2026. <u>UW Homepage</u>
- Adopted Standard: Institutions are required to meet the Web Content Accessibility
 Guidelines (WCAG) 2.1 Level AA standards. uwebresources.utah.edu
- Scope of Application: The rule applies to all digital content and services provided by public entities, including academic course materials, administrative websites, and mobile applications.

Let's do this! What is an Ally Course Accessibility Report?

Where is the Ally Course Accessibility tool? Be sure it is enabled. SETTINGS ->Navigation->Drag it into Navigation-> Students will not see it.

The **Ally Course Accessibility Report** in an LMS (like Canvas, Blackboard, or Moodle) uncovers how accessible your course content is for all students, including those with disabilities.

Here's what it specifically reveals:

Key Insights from the Ally Course Accessibility Report:

1. Overall Accessibility Score

○ Gives your course an overall score (0–100%) based on the accessibility of uploaded content.

2. File-by-File Breakdown

- Lists all documents (PDFs, Word files, PowerPoints, images, etc.) in the course and assigns each an individual accessibility score.
- Highlight which files have the most severe issues.

3. Types of Issues Detected

- Missing alternative text for images
- Scanned PDFs without OCR (Optical Character Recognition)
- Improper heading structure
- Low color contrast
- Tables without headers
- Unlabeled links or buttons
- Videos without captions

4. Content Type Summary



5. Guidance & Fix Suggestions

Ally not only identifies issues but explains how to fix them, often with step-by-step instructions.

6. Alternative Formats Available

 Ally automatically generates alternative formats (e.g., audio, ePub, tagged PDF, HTML) that students can download, regardless of whether the original file has issues Another way to view and "fix" accessibility in the Files of Canvas: Open "Files".
