

The Associate of Arts in Criminology degree examines the scientific study of crime, including the measurement, etiology, consequences, prevention, control, and treatment of crime and delinquency. The degree is designed to give students an introduction to the field. Courses focus on the characteristics and causes of crime and deviance and on the origins, nature, and consequences of societal reactions to crime and deviance, giving particular attention to the criminal justice system. Basic instruction is also given in sociological theory and research methods.
