

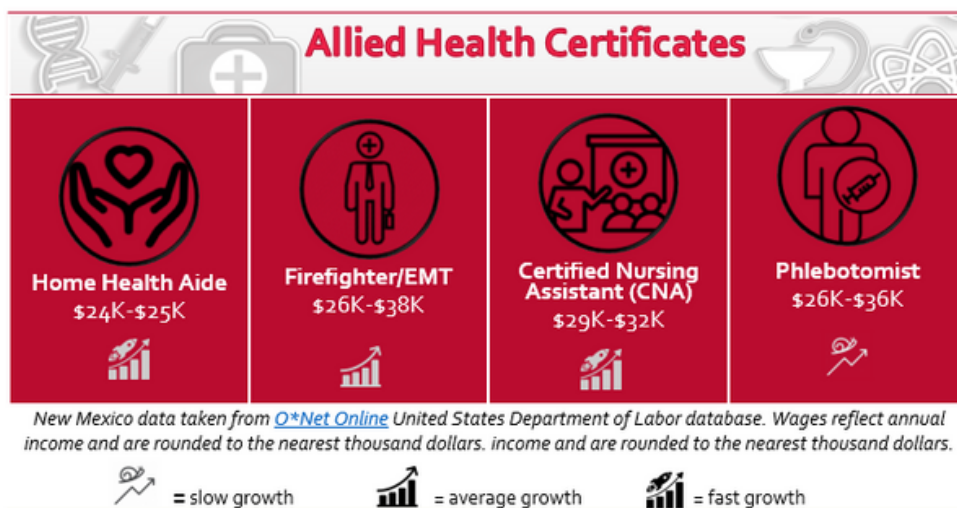
The Allied Health programs include Emergency Medical Technician Basic (EMT-Basic), Emergency Medical Technician Intermediate (EMT-I), Personal Care Attendant (PCA-Home Health Aid), Nursing Assistant (CNA), and Phlebotomy Technical (PBT). Each program is designed in a short-term format featuring hands-on, skills-based learning techniques in the UNM-Valencia Health Sciences Lab, followed by clinical skills training in various healthcare settings specific to each course. A UNM certificate is awarded upon successful completion of each of the Allied Health programs.
