Describe the six dimensions of wellness and the behavioral skills needed to establish a wellness lifestyle.</li> <li>2. Demonstrate the ability to apply principles of physical fitness, nutrition, weight control, stress management, and disease prevention.</li> <li>3. Describe the steps in creating a behavior management plan to change a health-related behavior.</li> <li>4. Develop a personal plan to track and change a particular health related behavior.</li> <li>5. Identify positive health behaviors necessary for one to maintain a high level of personal wellness.</li> </ol>

A traditional 3-credit general-education class meets for approximately 3 hours per week for 16 weeks. Since this is an online class, the in-class time is replaced by learning from readings and chapter exercises.</p> <p>Even though this is an online class, you can expect to put in the same amount of time as you would for a traditional class. You may find it impossible to succeed on the more difficult assignments if you wait until the last day before they are due to begin them. The skills we learn in this class require time, so it is your responsibility to manage your time accordingly.</p> <p>BE SURE TO KEEP THE SCHEDULE HANDY BECAUSE IT CONTAINS DUE DATES FOR THE ASSIGNMENTS.</p> <p><b><u>Attendance</u></b></p> <p>Your instructor will take attendance online. Students must log-on to <b>UNM Learn</b> regularly.</p> <p><b><u>Syllabus Quiz</u></b></p> <p>Students will read over the syllabus and complete the syllabus quiz, including signing an agreement at the end of the quiz, stating you read and understand the syllabus.</p>

**Introduction Post**

Each student will introduce themselves in the Introduction Blog and comment on at least 2 other introduction posts from students. Please be respectful. This will allow us to get to know one another.

**Chapter Assignments:** Students will submit chapter assignments on UNM Learn weekly. You will need to save the attachments, fill them out and upload them as a doc. File or PDF.

**Group Forums:** Each group will need to assign the following roles to its members: discussion facilitator, note-taker, researcher, and blogger. Everyone should be active discussants in addition to their role. The facilitator will need to take the lead in the group with communication and organization of information. The researcher will need to provide information and resources for the topic. At the end of the session, the note taker and blogger will be responsible for summarizing the discussion, getting feedback from group, and posting it on the class's blog site. Roles will be switched with each forum.

**Quizzes**

Quizzes will cover assigned chapters, discussions, and assignments. The quizzes may contain a combination of any of the following: multiple-choice, matching, true or false and essay questions.

**Personal Health Management Plans**

Towards mid-semester and end of the semester, students will complete a Personal Health Management Plan, setting goals and how they will track their progress.

**Late or Missing Assignment**

Late or missing assignments are unacceptable or depending on the situation. If you know ahead of time that you will miss an assignment or exam, please email me to make arrangements. Give at least 24 hours notice and email any appropriate documentation.

**Make Up Policy**
