COURSE DESCRIPTION:	To learn human gross anatomy through the dissection of human cadavers. This course is a supplement to your anatomy & physiology course.
COURSE OBJECTIVES:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Anatomical study. Direct your efforts toward exposing and correctly identifying those structures needed by the A&P labs. 2. Increasing your knowledge. Take the time to carefully study anatomical structures and improve your technique. 3. Enjoyment. As long as it doesn't compromise Nos. 1 and 2, we can explore new techniques and dissections in order to make the course more rewarding.
COURSE EXPECTATIONS:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. You are expected to attend five scheduled dissections, which will tentatively last for two hours each. Roll will be called promptly at the beginning of class. If you are not present for roll call you will be marked absent. Absence or tardiness will only be excused at my discretion and if you have consulted with me at least 24 hours in advance. More than one absence (even if for a good reason) will result in no credit for the course. (PLEASE DON'T BE LATE AND DON'T LEAVE EARLY!). 2. Work in a safe manner. 3. You are expected to perform a fair share of the work. 4. You are responsible for cleaning the lab before leaving. Needless to say, everyone is expected to pick up after themselves and to PROPERLY WRAP, SPRAY AND COVER THE CADAVERS. 5. No "guests" will be allowed unless they are explicitly invited to attend the dissection by the instructor. 6. Disruptive behavior will not be tolerated and can lead to being dropped from the course at the instructor's discretion.
GRADING:	Prosection is a "credit" "no credit" course worth one credit hour. <u>Credit will be given to those students who consistently meet the course expectations outlined above. Failure to meet the course expectations will result in a grade of no credit.</u>
