	Submit official high school or equivalent transcript and all official college transcripts to unmvaregistrar@unm.edu or have them mailed to the Registrar at 280 La Entrada Rd, Los Lunas, NM 87031.
	*Official transcripts are required in order to receive financial aid
	Set up your Net ID to access UNM's systems including LoboWeb, LoboAchieve, LoboMail, and UNM Learn. Not sure what a Net ID is and how to set one up, click here. NetID@unm.edu
	Federal law requires that you have a school email account where we can contact you securely. Please check this email frequently.
	Register for New Student Orientation.
	Use <u>LoboMail</u> to schedule a testing appointment with our test administrator, Joshua Owen at jowen2@unm.edu. Be sure to include your first & last name, date of birth, and your 9-digit UNM ID number. Prepare for the Accuplacer placement test <u>here</u> . Contact your Academic Advisor if you are interested in more involved test prep program.
	Call 505.925.8560 or utilize <u>LoboAchieve</u> to make an appointment with your Academic Advisor at least 2 weeks before registration to plan your courses. <u>You can find directions for using LoboAchieve</u> <u>here</u> . Review the <u>academic catalog</u> , which includes information about courses, programs, and policies at UNM-Valencia.
	DegreeAdvisor - Fall & Summer 2021 registration is now open Spring 2022 registration opens: November 2021
	Find out what books and supplies you will need for your classes at the <u>UNM-Valencia Bookstore</u> . You can then purchase them through our bookstore, online, or even rent them. Many of our students like this <u>website</u> for renting textbooks.
	Set up direct deposit for eRefunds and/or to make payments in MyUNM by visiting the <u>Bursar Account Suite</u> . You can access it by following the instructions below: • Go to <u>MyUNM</u> and log in with your UNM NetID and password, and enter LoboWeb • Click on <i>Make Payments, View Bill, Setup eRefunds, Installment Plans, etc.</i> • Finally, click on the Bursar Account Suite button
	Get a parking permit <u>here</u> ; it is FREE!
	Get your student ID at the library sometime before classes begin. It will probably be easier to wait for this until campus is open full-time in the late summer. You will need to visit the library and bring a photo ID and your UNM ID number. Check them out online for contact information.
	If you need help deciding what to study or clarification of your career path, make an appointment with Sarah Clawson, Career Advisor, using LoboAchieve, <u>sjclawson@unm.edu</u> or by calling 505.925.8840
	Apply for the Peer Mentor Program. Application available online through the Financial Aid page at valencia.unm.edu.

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

fafsa.gov

FAFSA is an application for Federal Student Aid that the federal government uses to determine *projected* eligibility for federal grants, loans, work-study and scholarships. The institution may use information provided on the FAFSA to determine eligibility for state grants and scholarships. **This application opens every October 1**st. You will need to fill it out once a year.

For assistance with completing the FAFSA you can book an appointment or call 505-925-8590.

If you are not a U.S. citizen, please contact the Financial Aid Office regarding your funding options. Si no tiene ciudadania de los Estados Unidos, por favor contacte la oficina de ayuda financiera con respecto a sus opciones.

Before starting your FAFSA you will need to create your Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID). If you are considered a dependent student, one of your parents must also create an FSA ID. This ID will be used every October 1st, so be sure to save it somewhere safe. To start go to: fsaid.ed.gov

What is the FSA ID?

- The FSA ID gives you and your parent(s) access to FSA online systems (FAFSA). Student and parent must have their own individual FSA ID in order to sign the application. **Do not** use the same email for both student and parent.
- The FSA ID is the fastest way to sign your application and have it processed.

NOTE: Please carefully read instructions and use the "see text" option to ensure that you are entering accurate data. You will be required to verify your email address. Do not close the browser until you enter the verification code and get a confirmation that your FSA ID is successfully created.

- Assets

Maintaining Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) (How to remain eligible to receive financial aid)

Completion Rate

• Complete 67% of total credits attempted.
• Non-passing or incomplete grades and withdrawals affect your completion rate

• Earn a miminum of 1.7 GPA for 1-30 credit hours
• Earn a minimum of 2.0 for 30 + credit hours

• Be registered in a degree seeking program and be progressing
• Complete the degree within 150% of credits required for that degree

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
